Fourteen new volunteer advocates joined the CASA ranks over the summer. A class of eight new volunteers took the oath with Judge Chris Cornish presiding on June 1st, 2021 and another 6 advocates were sworn in on July 20th with Judge Dallas Sims administering the oath to that group. Both groups immediately had cases assigned to them and began working with CASA supervisors to get acclimated to the casework and familiar with the history of each case they were assigned. Both classes have already proven to be assets to CASA and the children they represent. All of the new advocates felt the call to provide a voice for the children in foster care that are assigned to CASA. Howard Hawk, joined the Coffee with CASA program in early lune and told his story of wanting to give back to his community especially to serve as a mentor for young boys who need guidance and leadership at a critical time in their lives. Howard and George Fennell were part of a special effort called "Men of CASA" that was instigated by Recruiter/Trainer Lolita Gilmore to target finding more males to serve as CASA advocates.

Mike was raised in the foster care system as a child. His reflections on support he wished he could have received as a foster child led him to consider CASA as a recipient. He knew of the work CASA does to support foster children. Throw in a long-time friendship with a founding member of the CASA Bell/Coryell County office, **Yveta Phillips**, plus a good working relationship with the Past President **Tina Capito**, and Mike was certain he knew who to help. The final piece to the puzzle happened by good fortune when new CASA Executive Director,

Kevin Kyle, went to make an introductory visit with Mike at his restaurant back in January and listened to Mike's vision about creating a golf tournament. Over the next several weeks, conversations ensued and Kevin made sure that Mike was aware of CASA's need for financial support. In late spring, Mike finally broke the news that he had a date set for an outing, the time to organize it, and that CASA would be the

beneficiary of his efforts. During those early discussions, dreams of raising possibly \$5000 or more were merely that, dreams. Everyone agreed that success would be measured by making the

event fun for all. Money was not the ultimate goal. all for the entire day helped make it the most successful fundraising event in CASA history. Mike leads by example and he was one of the hardest working volunteers throughout the entire event. He wanted to be sure that every detail was covered so that each player, each sponsor, and everyone who participated had an enjoyable experience with the outing. The end result was proof that the friends and sponsors who played golf and attended the dinner at Wings, Pizza, n Things restaurant felt good about sharing their generosity with CASA. More than \$26,000 was raised for the agency and will be put to direct support of the children in foster care that CASA

Volunteer Advocate, Alasia Hunt, recently went well above and beyond the call of duty for her CASA case. She agreed to travel with me for a July visit on the child's birthday. The child was at a facility in north Texas approximately 4 hours away, so it was an all day trip. She even had to request time off from her job due to the extended travel time required to make the visit. The Sunday prior to our planned visit, the child's uncle passed away and the child started having behavior issues. The day of our visit, we were able to give the child an opportunity to show us around the facility, we took the child some presents from the CASA toy closet and from the family. A local agency that supports efforts to care for foster kids gave us a \$50 Walmart gift card, so we took the child shopping to get some items she needed and wanted for her birthday. We also took her out to lunch and the advocate used her own cell phone to make a three-way call with the child's two siblings that she had not seen in person since early June. The child's family has not been able to visit, so this was the first visit from anyone for her except for CPS caseworker visits that the child has received. The child seemed to enjoy the special outing for her 12th birthday and knowing that CASA cared enough to make the special effort to celebrate her birthday.

Alasia has continued to work the case and has since been able to take on a second case to serve 3 more children assigned to CASA. She truly is a selfless and caring CASA Advocate. We are grateful for the effort she makes to be the voice for CASA kids she serves.
